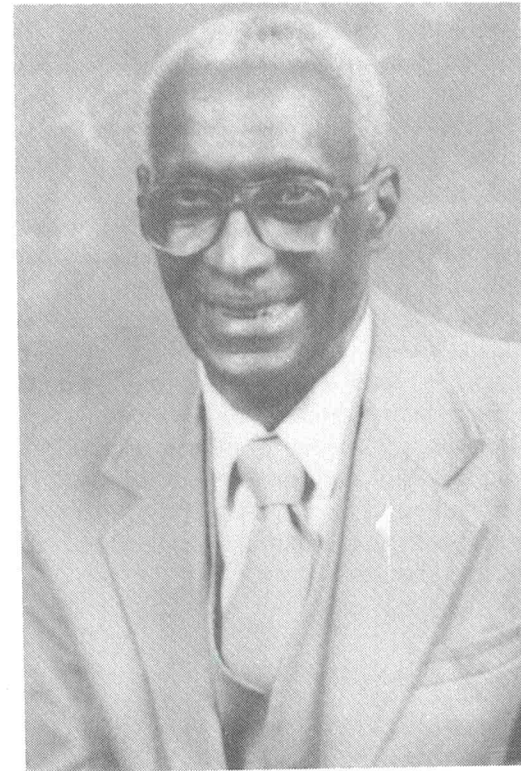

Obituary

On the evening of December 12, 1994, the Lord called into eternal rest Deacon Isaac Dudley Jasper at the Bulloch Memorial Hospital. Deacon Jasper was born January 18, 1916 to the late Mr. David and Nellie Jasper in Montgomery County, Georgia. The family later moved to Bulloch County where Dudley grew up.

He was a World War II Veteran, having served in Germany and France from 1943 to 1946. After his time in the service he returned home and later joined his wife in New York where they resided for 33 1/2 years.

While in New York he joined The Lowly Nazarene Baptist Church and later The Second Canaan Baptist Church where he served on the Senior Usher's Board.

The desire to return home to Statesboro grew strong and in 1978 he and Arrissie returned home. Being a Christian and spiritual man he soon became a member of The Original First African Baptist Church, where he was on the Senior Usher's Board and served as a deacon until his health failed.
