STATESBORO – Volleyball coach [Chad Willis](#) announced today that Paige Powers (Woodstock, Ga./Sequoyah) and Robin Rosser (Charlotte, N.C./Cox Mill) have signed to attend Georgia Southern and play for the Eagles, beginning in the 2021 season.

"We're thrilled to be announcing two more quality additions to our team for 2021," said Willis. "Paige and Robin will add tremendous depth to our pin position group while also bringing a high level of competitiveness and excellence on and off the court as we continue to build our culture. We are looking forward to welcoming them to campus this summer."

Paige Powers, 5-11, OH, Woodstock, Ga. / Sequoyah / A5

Lettered for coach John Edwards at Sequoyah High School and played club for coach Boba Nisavic at A5 • Named first-team all-state from 2018-20 and the 6A State Player of the Year and Region Offensive Player of the Year in 2020 • Named 2019 All-American Special Mention and earned all-region honors from 2017-20 • Posted 350 kills and 242 digs while hitting .360 as a senior • Owns school records for kills in a season (541) and kills in a match (31) • Finished career with 1,425 kills.

Willis on Powers:

"Paige is a dynamic six-rotation pin who can score and extend rallies defensively. In our conversations getting to know Paige, what sticks out to us is her demeanor and the way she approaches competing. Paige's experience training with Sequoia High School and A5 will be a tremendous asset for our program both on and off the court. Her personality and commitment to pursuing excellence align with our vision; her attitude and drive to get better will help us continue to elevate our culture."

Robin Rosser, 6-1, RS, Charlotte, N.C. / Cox Mill / Carolina Juniors

Four-year letterwinner for coach Ralph Viegelmann at Cox Mill High School • Ranked the No. 6 hitter in North Carolina in 2020 • Named all-state in 2020 and all-conference in 2019 and 2020 • Posted 350 kills and 32 aces as a senior • Played for Viegelmann on the Carolina Juniors 18 club team, and her team was named a top-50 club team in the nation by PrepVolleyball.

Willis on Rosser:

"Robin adds versatility and scoring potential as a lefty pin. Our staff has really been impressed with her skill progression the last two years; it's clearly a testament to Robin's work ethic and competitive drive. Robin's prep career at Cox Mill High School and Carolina Juniors has prepared her to make an impact here and in every conversation we've had, it's evident she has a great mindset and more importantly, is an outstanding person with teammate-attributes that will make our team better."

The duo joins Jordan Christy (Savannah, Ga./Habersham School), Paige Collins (Atlanta, Ga./Holy Innocents), Jillian Gray (New Lenox, Illinois/Joliet Catholic Academy), Logan Jones (Savannah, Ga./Savannah Christian), Ashley Lovett (Shawnee, Kan./St. James Academy) and Megan Vickery (Anderson, S.C./T.L. Hanna) who signed last fall.

"Our 2021 roster will be our deepest yet," said Willis. "There is a high level of talent and competitiveness across the board in each position group. I know I speak for our team and staff about being excited for our growth potential and seeing what's in front of us this fall."
