### Have your dog vaccinated

Our neighbors over in Emanuel County are having trouble with their fox population. For the past few weeks an epidemic of rabieshydrophobia-among foxes, as well as dogs, has been keeping the citizens of that county concerned and our local health department. warns us that the epidemic is gradually moving into that part of Emanuel adjoining Bulloch.

Dr. Hubert King, medical director of the health department, says that we can avoid a serious outbreak or epidemic in our county by taking drastic steps immediately.

He urges citizens in the county to have their dogs vaccinated against rabies at once. A series of clinics is scheduled for May 6-8. In the meantime it is desirable that all dog owners have their dogs vaccinated as soon as possible

It is warned that the large fox population in Bulloch increases the anger from this dreaded disease.

Don't wait until a dog or a fox has bitten your child or a member of your family to become concerned.

Get scared now-and do the thing needed to be done. Have your dog vaccinated.
