Meditation for This Week



ONE THING I KNOW "One thing I know, that whereas I was blind, now I see." John 9:25.

In chapters 8 and 9 of John's Gospel, our Lord stooped down and lifted himself up. His great act of condescension in coming down from heaven to the cross, and His return to heaven. In chapter 9, as He stoops here He spits on the dust, makes clay of the spit, and anoints the blind man with the clay.

It is thus that our Lord stooped, humbled Himself to the death of the cross and now appears that perish, foolishness, to the eyes of man. Naturally, the clay on this man's eyes would only make him see if it were possible. That is exactly the truth pictured here: for the preaching of the cross is, to them that perish, foolishness.

But the double darkness—that of the blind eyes and the blinding clay—was removed the moment this man in obedience to the word of God went to the pool of Siloam and washed. Let the sinner but obey the Word of God and his spiritual blindness will be healed and he will see. The preaching of the cross, which is the Word of God, becomes to the believing sinner the power and wisdom of God. It is so with the blind man and so with you.

WHEN SINNER has truly been saved by the grace of God, men will soon notice it. His neighbors asked, "is not this he that sat and begged?" It was the same man, but he was put in the past tense. A saved soul no longer sits and begs. He is now a man of God's glory and gives him the neighbors asked him how they were eyes opened, he tells them that a man called Jesus made clay and anointed his eyes and told him to go to the pool of Siloam and wash. How clear of vision was that! How clear of sight—a very simple, concise, straightforward, understandable testimony. He does not talk about himself but about what the Lord did for him. Many who today give their testimony might learn a useful lesson here.

THEN THEY bring the man to the Pharisees, but he does not tell them as much as he told the neighbors. Instead of putting it in the past tense, he now relates it in the present tense. "I washed, and do see." For some time, several days, he did want to win his neighbors, so he tells them the details of his healing in detail. The Pharisees might question that Jesus healed him but they cannot doubt the evidence before them. So it is more effective to show active evidence of salvation than to tell others that at some past time you were saved.

A steady, spiritual growth and development is seen in this blind man; not only had his physical eyes been opened, but the eyes of his heart as well. He learned to see Jesus as his Saviour and Lord. At first he calls Jesus a man; then he says Jesus is a prophet; then, that He is of "God"; and finally, he acknowledges and worships the Son of God. This man reminds us that the path of the just... shinneth more and more into the perfect day. From the time of his conversion, to find himself at last in the light of God, who is the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, and His Father and His Father and His Father.

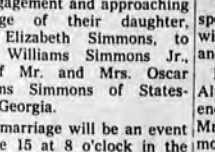

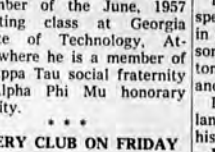

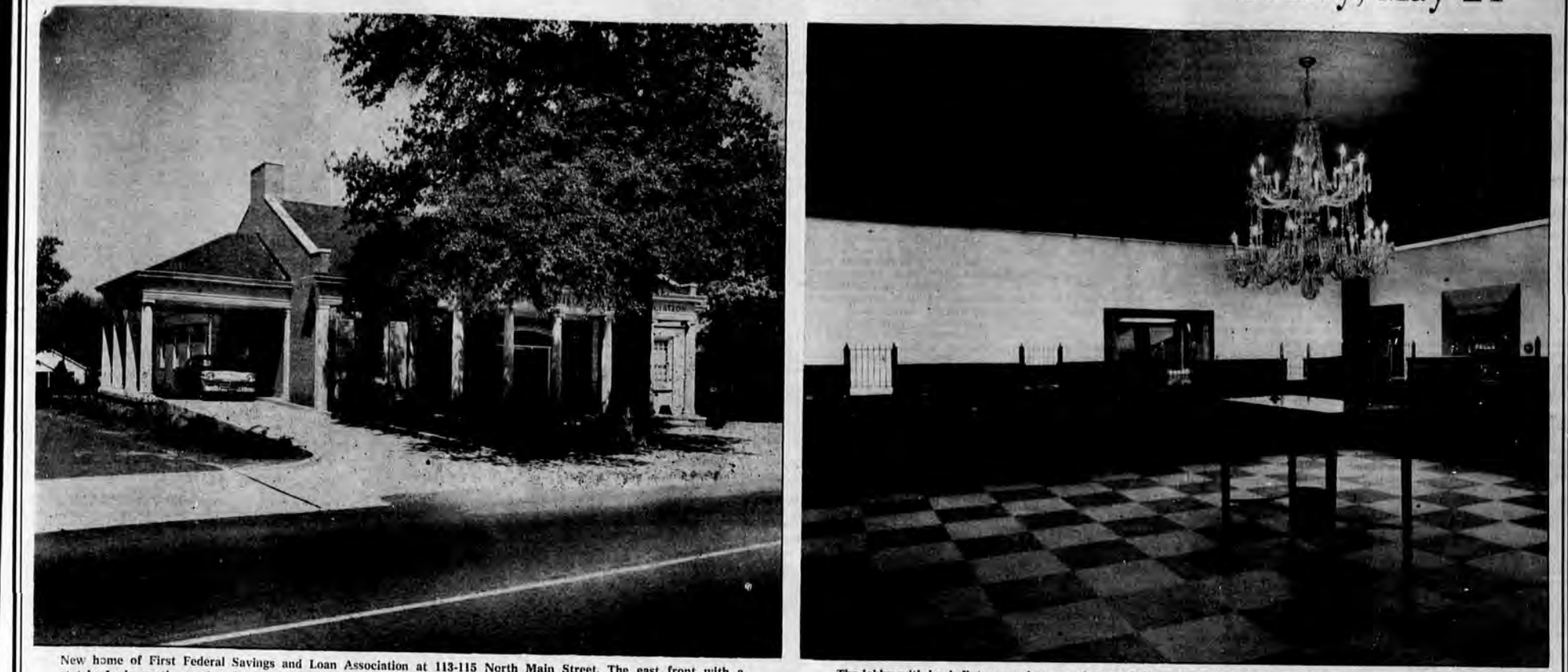
