## Are you protected?

Have you checked your automobile insurance policy recently? If you have not, this week is a good time to do so-and make it before May 28.

A new Georgia law, enacted by the 1957 General Assembly, increases the required proof of financial responsibility in connection with accidents and the revocation of licenses under the Georgia Motor Vehicle Safety Responsibility Act from \$5,000-\$10,000 to \$10,000-\$20,000 for personal injury. The provision of \$1,000 for property damage was

not changed. Stated simply-this means that now a car owner, under the state law, must be responsible up to \$10,000 to cover injury or death to one person in one accident and \$20,000 to cover two or more per-
