

Among some changes being discussed in high places in the state government is one which we approve and would like to see put on our law books.

This proposal would permit state senators to succeed them-

The present state law prohibits members of the Senatewith one exception-from succeeding themselves as a matter of right. The exception is the fifty-second senatorial district which comprise the single county of Fulton. In the other fifty-three districts, which are made up of more than one county, the senatorship must be rotated among the counties that comprise each unless an individual county waives its right to furnish a senator. This, of course, is a rare occurance.

As a result, a virtually new Senate is seated every two years There is no continuity of service; each Senate starts over from scratch.

An effort may be made soon to repeal the rotation law and require senatorial candidates to run throughout the district which, in most cases, consists of three counties. This would make it possible for a senator to succeed himself-if he can get re-elected.

'Dogwood Joe' dies
