

The Senator was answering a routine question put to him by a panel of newsmen on a TV program in Atlanta recently. The question dealt with the possibility of the U. S. Supreme Court knocking down the County Unit System unless some changes are made, such as reapportionment to meet county population shifts.

We say this for Senator Talmadge, he must have known that the fur would fly when he answered the question. The gist of what he said was this: "The Supreme Court might change their mind and reverse the existing law, and, of course, that situation is entirely possible . . . I think it is entirely possible that the Legislature study that question. It's not possible but even probable that some readjustment would perhaps be wise. . . . I haven't tried to make any suggestions either to the Governor or the General Assembly and wouldn't attempt to do so. Of course, if any of them ask my advice I'd be happy to discuss it with them and try to give some constructive suggestions along that line. But unless someone does so, of course, I wouldn't be so brazen as to attempt to make suggestions as to how the business of the state government ought to be run."

The reaction was swift and something like a stirred-up hornet's nest.

There are a large number of Georgians who will go along with a change of the County Unit System if Herman Talmadge says so. And that's a tribute to the loyalty of his followers and supporters. But there are also signs of increasing opposition from state politicians of the old school to any fiddling with the County Unit System.

And the former Governor Marvin Griffin is assuring Georgians "I will not steal their heritage from them."

There are those who voice cautions opinions that the increasing population shift to the cities should be recognized by giving more unit votes to these more populated areas.
