### A Pioneer spirit and mechanical resourcefulness developed Rockwell

The pioneer spirit and mechanical resourcefulness that helped develop American industry is closely associated with the history of Rockwell Manufacturing Company. In fact, it is this spirit which developed Rockwell from a small meter company to a company with many divisions strategically located throughout the country.

Rockwell really began in the early 1880's when George Westinghouse Jr. invented a meter to measure gas as it flowed from a well to his home. To manufacture these meters commercially, he organized the Pittsburgh Equitable Meter Company. After the Mellon family of Pittsburgh assumed control of the company's operations, their first step was to find the right man to run their new venture. They chose Colonel W. F. Rockwell, a native Bostonian, who had brought a Wisconsin automotive parts plant from the brink of bankruptcy to prosperity. With diversification, ingenuity, and faith as his philosophy, the offer from the Mellon family provided an opportunity for him to further extend his ideas and beliefs in the great potential of American industry. The next decade wit-

In late 1945, Captain W. F. Rockwell Jr., returned from the Army and became General Manager of the organization. Expansion and diversification of product line continued with the acquisition of plants producing gas pressure regulators, cast and forged steel valves for higher temperature pressure services, lubricated valves, and hydraulic drives. The same year Delta Manufacturing Company of Milwaukee, makers of small machine tools for the home hobby shop and industry, were acquired. In 1947 W. F. Rockwell Jr. became president of the company with his father as chairman of the board.

nessed the acquisition of the H. A. Smith Machine Company in Hopewell, New Jersey and the Merco Nordstrom Valve Company.

**COMPANY EXPANSION BEGINS**  
 After A. W. Mellon and R. B. Mellon died, the Mellons sold their interest in the enterprise, and Colonel Rockwell and his associates purchased most of the stock. During the next ten years the company continued to expand, adding new plants and products to the organization. On November 30, 1945 the stockholders of the Pittsburgh Equitable Meter Company changed the company's name to Rockwell Manufacturing Company.

dental gas meters and regulators, Rockwell's employees now produce water meters and commercial and industrial devices as well as valves, power tools, gas and liquid regulating and control equipment, taxi meters, parking meters, and allied products which are used in most of the basic industrial and engineering fields.

Each division of the company is sufficiently independent to operate with the flexibility inherent only in a small business yet each enjoys the advantages of large-scale centralized purchasing and research facilities, the pooling of collective manufacturing knowledge, and the economies of mass marketing. Under the Rockwell pattern, the individual divisions prosper to a greater extent than if separately operated.
