

He is concerned with the indifference and apathy of the commu-

nity to this problem.

Dr. Brown estimates that there are over 5,000 dogs in Bulloch County and that until recently only 782 had been vacinated. Mayor Bowen states that hardly more than 100 dogs have been treated in the City of Statesboro.

Trouble is wrapped up in these figures and the indifference of the community to them. An outbreak of rables in a community like ours is unthinkable-yet the seed of such an outbreak is here.

It is to prevent such an outbreak that this dog count is being undertaken by the Jaycees.

If all in Statesboro give their cooperation Statesboro can be made absolutely safe from rabies. And to provide this safety it is necessary that the health officials and city officals know how many dogs there are, where they are and to whom they belong and if they have been vaccinated.
