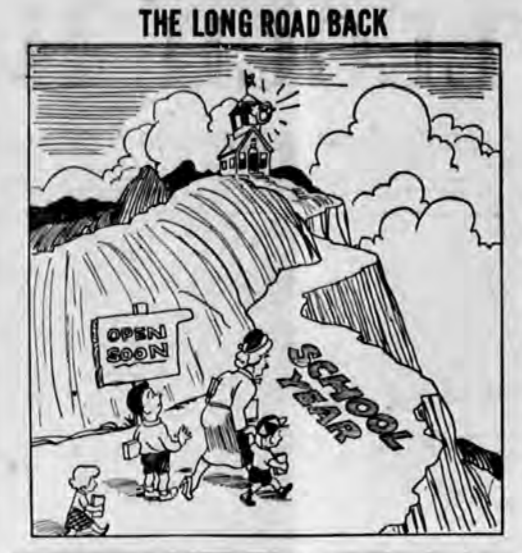

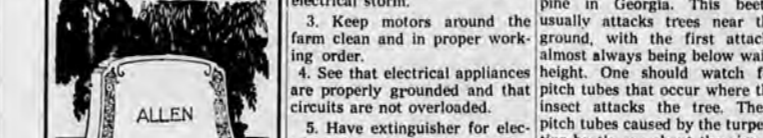

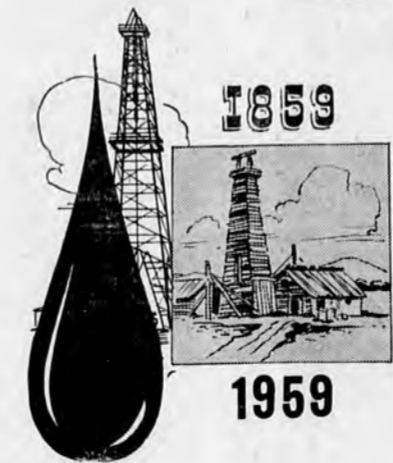

IRONING PETTICOATS  
Nylon or dacron petticoats may be ironed white dry. Cotton petticoats are easier to iron if the body of the skirt is ironed on the right side first, then the petticoat is turned wrong-side out and the ironer proceeds starting with the top one.
