How to grow sturdier tobacco plants

HAVE YOU EVER wondered how some farmers manage to grow sturdy, well-rooted tobacco plants every year? There's no mystery to how they do it. It's simply a matter of following sound practices and applying the proper plant foods at the right times.

Here's how M. J. (Jack) Jordan, of Blackshear (Pierce County), second largest commercial tobacco plant grower in Georgia, produces strong, vigorous plants for his customers: "My first step in growing strong plants is to prepare a good seed bed and disk in 200 pounds of AGRIKO FOR PLANT BEDS 4-9-3 and 50 pounds of nitrate of soda per hundred square yards. Rabbits inflicting heavy damage to pine seedlings says county agent

At this season there is always a need for good foliage preservatives. If you don't have much to choose from in the way of foliage for decoration, now would be a good time to plant some shrubs or trees in the yard which might be used specifically for cutting purposes.

Several good choices for cutting include: Buffalo Holly, Cornuta Holly, Nandina, and Pyracantha. The foliage on some of these plants is also decorative.

RABBITS ARE SEEDLINGS—Rabbits like to eat nice green grass, but after freezes when grass is scarce, they may eat green pine seedlings. In some areas of the state damage to seedlings from rabbits has been severe.

Forest research in various parts of the South has shown the possibilities of copper carbonate as a rabbit repellent. Spraying at the nursery prior to handling has resulted in heavy seedling losses.

CORN SPACING—Thick spacing of corn is one of the best means of preventing soil erosion in growing row crops. When corn is properly spaced, with a few weeks the soil is protected from downpours of rain.

ROTATING COASTAL BERMUDA—A means of managing a rotation of Coastal Bermuda grass and corn so the Coastal will re-establish itself without the expense of new springing has been developed by the Georgia Agricultural Experiment Station and USDA.
