Bub Beal found Saturday at his home in Whitesville, murdered

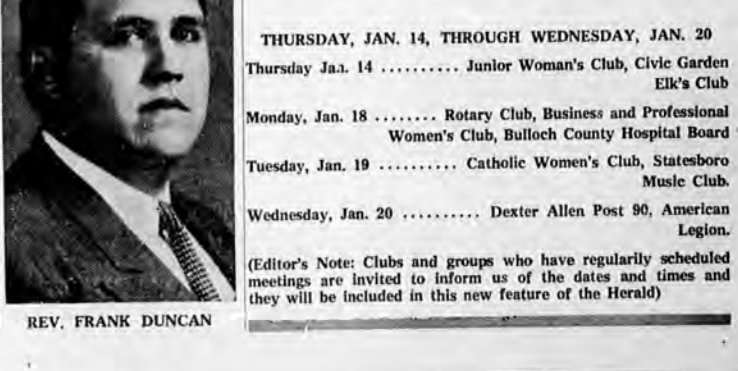

The old-year-1959 is gone. A new year is upon us. But lets not forget 1959, because it made us wiser in many respects. As we all learn from past experiences, so the old year taught us something in Soil and Water Conservation.

I think the most important advances last year were: 1. Grass based crop rotations coming of age. 2. Much farming gaining wide acceptance.

There were over 40 miles of drainage ditches were dug. 13 farm ponds were built. 842 acres of permanent pastures were planted on cooperators farms.

Recent research at the Southern Piedmont Experiment Station at Watkinsville, Georgia, shows how cotton benefits from irrigation. For the last three years, the increased yield on irrigated plots of cotton has averaged 1500 pounds of seed cotton.

Spacing can be the limiting factor in economical corn production. In order to make a high yield per acre, there must be enough plants. Many factors should be used in determining the number of plants per acre.

For most soils adapted for corn in South Georgia, about 10,000 plants uniformly spaced should be used. For most soils adapted for corn in North Georgia, about 12,000 plants should be uniformly spaced.

Farm and Family Features... Farmers saving cotton seed should have them tested before planting... By Roy Powell, County Agent

Georgia farmers who have saved their own cotton seed for planting next spring should have a germination test made on these seeds before using them for planting purposes.

Next spring is to have the seed tested and adjust their planting rate according to the germination of their seed.

There are several advantages to faster growth. First, more rapidly growing animals usually need less feed to reach maturity. And, secondly, bull calves and calf heifers can be shipped to market sooner.

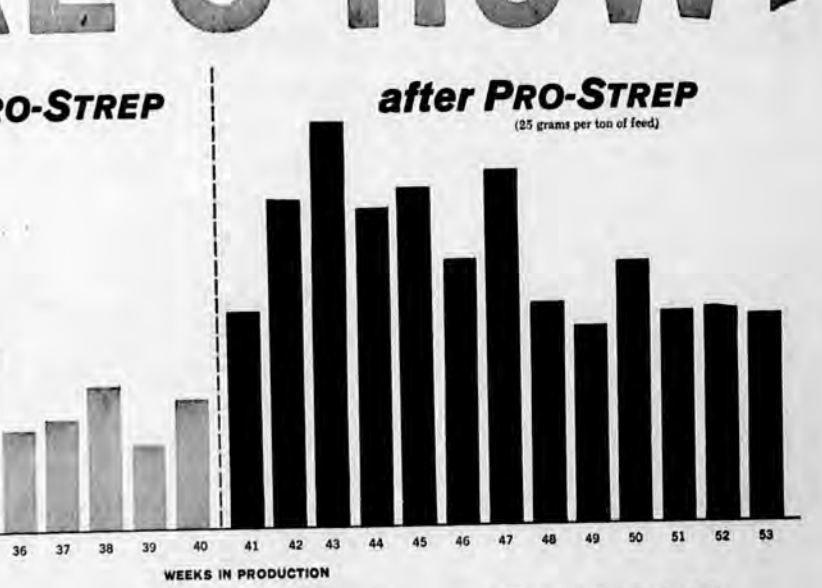

The PROOF of the PRODUCT is on THE FARM... Don't let stresses, such as sudden temperature changes and subclinical infections, throw your flock off feed and into egg production slumps.
