Many improvements have been made since April of last year when the Governor Vandiver, acting upon the recommendations of a special study group named by the Medical Association of Georgia, transferred responsibility for the hospital from the Department of Public Welfare to the Department of Public Health. Now the future must provide for adequate hospital staff, new buildings, renovation of old buildings, and facilities to keep the day-to-day operation of the hospital up to satisfac-

ditional expenditures was recommended to the General Assembly last week by Governor Vandiver. Under it Milledgeville State Hospital spending would rise from \$10.7 million to \$12 million. Bills now before the General Assembly will insure the appropriation of the needed funds, but these bills will not be enacted into law without the support of the great majority of the people of Georgia.

It will take these new funds to give our state an adequate mental health program.






