





Dr. Zach Henderson, president of the College, answered that question to the complete satisfaction of the eighty-seven members of the Statesboro Rotary Club at their Monday meeting at Mrs. Bryant's Kitchen.

He round-figured it at \$2,000,-000,00, He pinpointed \$1,807,839 and estimated the balance.

In explaining the economic implications of the College for the community he said that the College staff numbered 132 and that are on the labor force, making a total of 192 people making a financial contribution to our community's economy.

The education and general payroll amounts to \$771,781. The auxiliary payroll totals \$138,458, and the local share of the new building payroll totals \$255,600.






