Britt Fayssoux Art Kraft, retired fireman, becomes golf professional

Art Kraft, 47, a retired fireman turned golf pro, believes that one is never too old to learn new things.

He retired from the Los Angeles Fire Department five years ago after 20 years of service, and since then has become a golf professional who has earned a reputation for being one of the game's better instructors.

Kraft, who is now pro at the Statesboro Country Club, had his first job as a head pro at the Warm Springs Country Club where he taught polo patients how to play golf.

Dr. Jonas Salk, the discoverer of the polio vaccine, began playing golf with Kraft in Warm Springs.

Many times after taking lessons a person's score may go up, but when the things learned during lessons take effect invariably the pupil will begin shooting better golf, he said.

Kraft joined the Los Angeles Fire Department in 1936. Until his retirement five years ago he participated in amateur golf events sponsored by the California State Fire Department.
