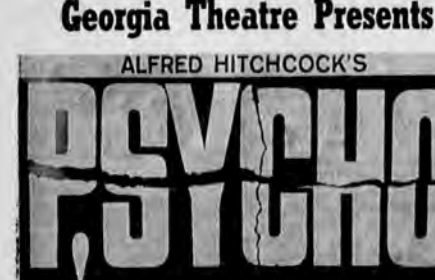

AAU meet next April. After that, the American gymnastic team will meet the Japanese Olympians in May. Then in 1961, the Americans hope to repay the visit to Russia.

Later, for Doris, there'll be the World Championships in Czechoslovakia in '61, the Pan-American Games in Brazil in '63, then—the hopes—the Olympics again at Tokyo in '64.

"I'm also competing for Georgia Southern now... or soon will be," Doris said. "Mr. Yeager is lining up a team schedule now. The first two meets will take place at the Florida Clinic at Sarasota."

The high flying lass is eager for new honors, but she already owns more championships than she can list.

She started working at gymnastics only five years ago and that same year, 1955, won the National AAU flying ring crown for the Rochester CYO.

In her second year of competition, she earned a berth on the U. S. Olympics team and finished fifth in the world at Melbourne.

Others honors have come fast—the Midwest championship in 1957, the Canadian National Exhibition title in '58, the National AAU in '58, the Pan-American Trials in '59, the Canadian National in '60, and the All-American in '58, '59 and '60.

A Thrill To Remember Her biggest honor and topmost thrill came in the recent Olympics at Rome. She scored eighth in the world on the uneven bars, the only American ever to place that high.

"It was the best competition in my life," Doris exclaimed. "I didn't let the U. S. down, and I'm thankful for that. When I came off those bars, the applause was tremendous. I'll never forget it."

There's another chapter to Doris' Roman holiday. The European—and American—press made much of her "friendship" with a handsome Russian Olympian named Boris Nikonorov.

They were photographed together repeatedly. One of the pictures of Doris and Boris juggling made the pages of the Morning News serious developer.

"Let's don't talk about that," Doris twinkled. "Let's just say that Boris is a nice guy and we became good friends."

The German-born miss—she spent some childhood years in a concentration camp in Czechoslovakia—is quite a gal. She packs a 38½-24-38½ figure into a 116-pound, five-foot frame.

She was Life Magazine's cover girl for the Sept. 12 issue. Besides beauty and talent, Doris speaks four languages: She handles English, German and Spanish without trouble and is studying Russian now.

But her most striking asset is her burning desire to improve, to reach her third Olympics in 1964, and to win.

As she puts it, "It's Tokyo or bust."
