



Rotary hears report on General Assembly

Bulloch County Repesentative ones Lane was not coy about it at all as he talked to the Statesboro Rotary Club Monday and told them that he was against the Appropriations Bill as it was passed in the Georgia General assembly which adjourned on Monday of last week.

The bill as it was passed pro vides for a budget of \$412,000,000 for 1961-62 and \$420,000,000 for 1962-63.

Representative Lane sees deficit spending in this new appropriations bill and an increase of taxes as a result.

He told Rotarians how the budget bill was put together and the way department heads accumu-late funds they do not use from year to year, yet they asked for and got the same amount or more year after year to add to the surduses they had accumulated since 1956 when the last appropriation bill was passed. He expresses his isapproval of this sort of thing.

Mr. Lane favored restricting the Governor's power to spend surplus funds to \$10,000,000. He thinks it is wrong to give the state's chief executive this power which could result in the willful waste of the people's money.

Mr. Lane made it perfectly of obscene material. plain that he is against anything that would increase the taxes or the people of Georgia and added that if the people of Bulloch County want to keep him at home from the General Assembly next election, that was alright with him, but he wanted them to know that he could not support anything that was not right.

Federal Court in Washington, D. C. on charges of conspiring to use the mails in the transmittal

Postmaster General Day said: "We in the Post Office Department are gratified at the sentences given to these serious offenders who have been convicted of using the mails to transmit smut material."

He added that the post office has plans for the toughest crackdown ever conducted for such violaters of the laws against mailing pornographic material.

The post office department still needs the assistance of the public in reporting receipt of illegally mailed material. If you or your children should receive any of this filth report it to Postmaster Reppard DeLoach here in Statesboro. It will help to save the envelope for him also. He'll follow through on it in accordance with the post office department's new policy.



A. Yes. The grade insures the quality of the egg, not the size. The words "Extra Large," "Large." "Medium," and "Small" represent the minimum weight in ounces per dozen, not including two ounces for the carton. A dozen small Grade A eggs must weigh a minimum of 18 ounces.

Q. Since Grade B and C eggs are lower in quality, what are their uses?

A. Grade B and C eggs can be used for thickening custards, pie fillings, sauce and salad dressings; hard cooked to be served creamed or chopped in selads, and for scrambled eggs or with other foods such as mushrooms, onions, tomatoes and spaghetti.


