STATESBORO – The Georgia Southern men's and women's tennis teams combined to raise \$2,209 in donations for cancer research over the month of November, over \$700 more than their goal.

The goal of No-Shave November is to raise cancer awareness by forgoing shaving and embracing the hair that many cancer patients lose. Donating the extra money one would usually spend on grooming supplies to No-Shave November helps provide information and funds to cancer patients and their caregivers.

"I am very proud of the effort of both teams really going after it. We have been doing this initiative for four years now and it is the most we have raised since we started," head men's coach [Sander Koning](#) said. "I'd like to give a big shout out to the women's tennis team for helping us with this cause.
