He is a member of the 26th Signal Construction Battalion which is engaged in reclaiming field wire and cable strung by the fighting forces.

To date the battalion has saved recovering 325 miles of field wire and some 95 miles of cable. A reel of cable, one-quarter mile in length, costs \$175. One mile of field wire costs the Army \$70.
