Disaster Loans Now AvailableInBulloch

Mr. R. L. Vansant, State Director, Farmers Home Administration, announces that the Secretary of Rites Held For Agriculture has designated all counties in Georgia as disaster areas in which Disaster loans may be made to eligible farmers and be made to eligible farmers of stockmen under the provisions of the prov

crops and pastures as a result of the drought in Georgia.

Under this program, loans are designed to help an established farmer or stockman meet the expense of continuing his farming or livestock operations when he has suffered a substantial loss and is unable to obtain the necessary funds from local banks, cooperative lending institutions, or other responsible credit sources. These loans are not made to refinance secured or unsecured indebtedness or to compensate for losses suffered in the disaster. They are made to eligible applicants (or production purposes when, with the help of the loan, there is a sound basis for successful operations in the future.
