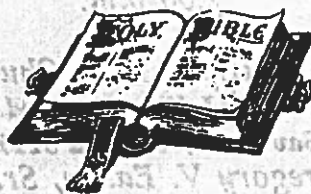
After serving a tour of duty in the U.S. Army during World War II and earning the rank of sergeant, he received an honorable discharge from the service.
