ministration. It has now grown to the extent that the city now includes 2,500 acres a year to set out throughout the city. All this at a very little cost.

"The financial condition of the city is far above that of the average community. Like any other business we have had to borrow from the banks, but by November 15 we will owe no note or open accounts, except, of course, the current ones. All money borrowed by the city will be paid by the 15th of this month.

"The city has always met its bond obligations promptly as they come due. Since 1946 we have retired \$70,500 on our bonded indebtedness.

"There are lots of things we realized that need doing and we haven't been able to do them because the funds were not available. "The tax rate of the city has not been increased in the past five years. Think the city can be commended upon the economic way things have been accomplished by this administration.

"There are other things that have been done—including the creation of a housing authority for which funds have already been allocated.

"The city has been sponsor of the Georgia Power Company's "Better Hometown Contest," and two years ago we won third place in our classification, last year we moved into second place and we are holding our breath hoping for first place this year. Two years ago the city has been cited for our safety record... all of which we are proud."

Let's Make Him A Great President

IKE EISENHOWER will become the president of the United States on Tuesday, January 20, 1953.
