The Fight Is On

THE BULLOCH COUNTY Health Department is going to war against flies and mosquitoes again this year.

Since the department began using D.D.T. as a weapon to fight flies and mosquitoes they have built up a resistance to the weapon.

This year the department is stepping up the concentration of DDT from three and six-tenths per cent to five percent and it is believed that the fly kill will be greater than it has in the past.

This spray program has become a part of the health department's program to make our community more enjoyable in which to live.

However, for the past two or three years there have been complaints questioning the effectiveness of the program in providing protection against house

The program was originaly instituted for protection against the malaria mosquito, but people thought of it and still think of the program as one to eliminate

Health authorities know that DDT is still very effective against the mosquito, but they have learned that the common house fly has the ability to develop a certain degree of resistance to practically all insecticides over a period of time. The fly cannot develop complete resistance an any chemical insecticide, but it can develop a resistance to prevent complete extermination. It is estimated that DDT will kill about 65 to 70 per cent of house flies that come in contact with the residual spray on the walls or ceilings for a long enough period of time.

Because of these findings the department is increasing the concentration of the DDT up to five per cent, thus building up its effectiveness to kill.
