On January 18, 1777, Congress ordered that "authenticated copies, with the same names of the Members of Congress subscribing the same, be sent to each of the United States, and that they be desired to have same put upon record." Authenticated copies were printed in broadside form by Mary Katharine Goddard in Baltimore, where Congress was then in session.




