At a meeting in Atlanta of the Georgia State Medical Education Board, John N. Shearouse was one of the 25 students to receive a medical scholarship.

In awarding these scholarships, it is the aim of the Medical Board to provide more physicians for rural Georgia.

Mr. Shearouse is the youngest son of Mrs. J. N. Shearouse and the late Mr. Shearouse, a prominent rail road financier until his death.

Young Shearouse is a graduate of the Brooklet High School and a licensed embalmer from the School of Embalming in Los Angeles, California.

During his term of service in World War II, he made 6 trips over the water from California to foreign fields, assisting with the sick and wounded.

After completing his service in the war he entered Emory University in Atlanta, where he graduated, and he then entered the Medical College of Georgia in Augusta last fall and has recently completed his first year.
