Place half ham (shank or butt) on a rack in a shallow roasting pan. Do not add water. Do not cover. Place in a sloc oven. 325 degrees, and bake 25 minutes per pound. Half an hour before end of baking time, take ham from oven. Remove rind from shank portion and cut fat surface in shallow crisscross gashes. Stick with whole cloves and spread with this glaze. Mix sifted brown sugar with just enough concentrated orange julce (thawed but not diluted) to moisten. Spread over fat, return ham to oven and in 15 minutes, spread with more sugar mixture. Let ham set in warm place 15 minutes before alicing.
