Obituary

Luetta Theodosia Leverette Moore, born in Lincoln County, Georgia was the thirteenth child of Anthony and Sallie Will Leverette. She grew up in Wilkes County, and attended school there. Her formal education included attendance at Brewton Normal in Greenwood, South Carolina, and Savannah States College, Savannah, Georgia.

After her marriage to Jesse L. Moore, they moved to Statesboro, Georgia in 1940, and to this marriage six children were born.

After moving to Statesboro, she joined the Greater Bethel A.M.E. Church where she served as a member of the Trustee Board, a Sunday School Teacher, Youth Director, and a member of the Public Relations Committee.

Mrs. Moore was an active member of the now extinct Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers, and held offices on the local, state and national level. This organization motivated her to become involved with youth services. Luetta joined the Statesboro Recreation Department in July 1956, and served until her retirement in 1985. She was recognized by the Georgia Recreation and Park Society for dedicated and loyal service to the field of recreation.

Luetta's many community service involvements included serving as chairperson fo the Altamah Area Communities Acting Together and the United Way of Bulloch County. She was a member of the Garden Club Association of Georgia, and served as president of the local club and as an officer on the district and state levels, and a Mary Kay Sale Representative for the passed 15 years. Her pleasing personality won for her many friends and associates.

Her demise on Sunday, March 23, 1986, has left a pall of sorrow upon her family, and many friends and associates.
