# Farm News

### W. L. Huggins talks on prison rehabilitation work at Reidsville

Rehabilitation work carried out at the state prison farm that is in Bulloch county is being discussed at a meeting of the Portals Farm Bureau at Reidsville, Ga., today.

Mr. W. L. Huggins, chairman of the Portals Farm Bureau, reported that the \$1,100,000 school building program set up for Bulloch county should get under way about May 1. This one letting of the contracts will just about complete the building program now proposed, he pointed out. There will be some additional work needed, he predicted, at some of the schools that are not being altered by the consolidation program.

Huggins enumerated the advantages where men and women are brought to the farm after they were placed in the industrial or agricultural phase of the rehabilitation program and the people eventually released as a result to society.

Many of the men and women are now earning excellent salaries, he stated.

He enumerated the many activities of the prison that have helped train them for self-employment. Instructors available to help with the work for the inmates at Reidsville are the other state institutions available to keep the person busy, he stated.

Facilities at none in the state, according to Mr. Huggins, is as well cared for as the one at Reidsville. Mr. Womack, county school superintendent, advised the group that the plans now call for the children in the West side of town.

Mr. J. R. Chester, associated chairman announced the community group and the contest would be held at the next meeting, April 27.

Herman Nessmith assigned the areas of the county to serving committees for contacting for the contest.

### The case of the obstinate pine tree in Bulloch

There is a Bulloch county pine tree, the most obstinate loblolly pine tree. By all the laws of nature this tree should have died 20 years ago, but it is still living, in good health, and producing seed cones regularly.

In the fall of 1933, the late E. A. Proctor, who lived on a farm two miles south of Reidsville in Bulloch County, girdled this loblolly pine, as he did several others. Proctor was interested in improving his stand of slash for producing gum turpentine, and the loblolly produces little or no gum.

The other trees girdled by Proctor died, as they should have, during the winter and spring of 1934.

But not this pine. It lived, grew new shoots at the ends of the limbs, and, in fact, rather seemed to enjoy the challenge.

Proctor girdled the tree again in the fall of 1934, but the loblolly paid no heed. It kept on living.

So, Proctor kept on girdling the tree; and the pine kept on living and growing. The tree was girdled a total of 10 times, maybe more, Proctor's son, N. A. Proctor, said. The son now owns the farm and operates it with the help of two of his own sons, Edwin and Delbert. C. E. Lavelly, Union Bag and Paper Corp. field representative, noticed the tree while marking the Proctor forest for an inventory.

### Gave Up Trying

"Why, yes, it is," Proctor commented. "Father knew how to guide a tree. Just look, he kept hacking away so that the girdle runs at least a foot up and down the trunk of the tree."

"But look at this," said Lavelly, who had been doing some figuring. "The rate of growth above the girdle has been greater than the average for loblolly pines in Georgia! This tree should have died 20 years ago, but instead it is thriving."

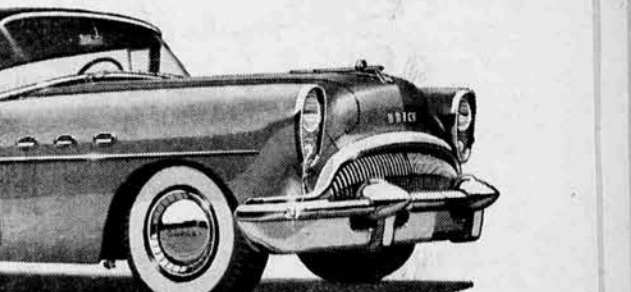
