



foreign countries have turned to our Georgia Teachers College to help to fill the teacher needs of their schools.

recognized as one of the finest teachers colleges in the country. Yet it is unable to supply the terrific demand upon it for teachers. Year after year it is the same. "We need teachers" school superintendents and school board chairmen say.

The demand for teachers is nationwide

But Dr. Jim Park of the college has reduced the teacher problem to state size. He believes that Georgia Teachers College is destined to take the lead as a source of the nation's finest

He brought the problem into focus at a meeting of the Statesboro Rotary Club recently.

He pointed out that Statesboro and Bulloch county are in preferred positions-our schools are not sufering the great teacher shortage which is spreading over our country. With the college here many wives of college professors filling teacher needs here, which together with other factors gives us complete teacher staffs.

But other places in the state are feeling the teacher shortage

From a survey Dr. Park conducted here reveals these figures: One hundred twenty - three representative school districts in Georgia employed 2,525 new teachers in 1954-55, of which 1,553 were for elementary class-

rooms and 927 for high schools. Of these 2,525 new teachers employed in 123 school districts the following sources were drawn

upon for the numbers indicated: From Georgia institutions of teacher preparation, 708 or 28 per cent; from other public schools in the state, 679 or 27 per cent; from local communities not formerly teaching, 594 or 23.5 per cent; from out-of-state, 525 or 20.8 per cent; from sources not identified, 79 or 00.7 per cent.

Only four districts of 123 reported they employed no new eachers in 1954-55.

There were 123 vacancies in the elementary schools and 41 vacancies in the high schools when school opened in September, 1954 in the 123 districts of Dr. Park's

Forty school districts (32.5 per cent of the 123 schools participating in the survey) still had unfilled vacancies in elementary schools when school began last September.

Thirty-one districts (25 per cent) still had unfilled vacancies in high school when school began last September.

Of the teachers employed in the 123 Georgia school districts this

full professional certificate. Dr. Park explained that these figures projected to include all schools in Georgia mean that approximately 3,229 elementary and 226 high school or a total of 3,455 school teachers in Georgia hold sub-professional certificates this year.
