

After we had assured them that we were not in the market for a bag of boiled peanuts at that time, we expected them to leave us and seek other prospects.

But not so.

They stayed around in our office-picking up first one thing then another on our desk, admittedly nothing of any value. There was a little glass frog the glass blowers in Sarasota, Fla. had made for us. There were a couple of staplers, several pencils, a set of mailing scales and things that newspaper editors kept on their desk, which would be of interest to kids. We took time out and told them about the glass blowers, and turned back to our work.

They moved out of the office into the back shop and they piddled around the typesetting machine, the press, and tried to

Finally they left. It set us thinking.
