Jessie Dekle Nicholson was born on January 10, 1917 in Bulloch County to the late Ivey and Nolie Woodberry Dekle. She attended grade school at Portal, GA and Willow Hill, and then went on to graduate from William James High School in Statesboro, GA.

After graduating, she lived in Statesboro for many years before moving to Philadelphia in 1941. She started working at the Philadelphia Naval Base Shipyard. There she met and married Harold Taylor, and to this union two sons were born. With one preceding her in death. Kermit Nicholson, Sr. After the death of Harold she met and married William (Nick) Nicholson, who preceded her in death.

She was a member of Scarboro Grove Baptist Church, where she served as mother of the church, and a member of Goodwill and Charity Lodge #2 and a representative for mission department in 3rd District and served on Women Missionary Baptist Convention Senior Department.
