JANET BRANNEN HONORED ON FIFTH BIRTHDAY

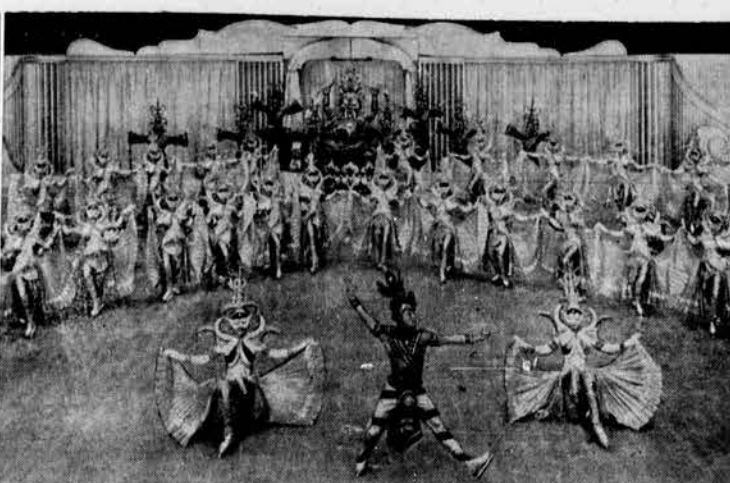
Mrs. Dock Brammen honored her daughter, Janet, with a party on her fifth birthday, Saturday, February 18, at the Recreation Center.
