And the dedication of the new National Guard Armory at Swainsboro last week focuses the spotlight on one of these blank spots in our community. Our 101st AAA Battalion (90

mm) of the Georgia National Guard is unhappy about the building which they are forced to call armory." The 187 citizen soldiers of Statesboro and Bulloch county cannot point with pride nor can they boast of our armory when they attend camp, or when they meet with the citizen soldiers of other units in the area-Swainsboro, for instance.

They deserve better than they now have. Located out on U. S. 301 across the highway from our new Rockwell Statesboro Corporation plant, visitors see it only as a dilapidated building.

The local unit is made up of 187 enlisted men and officers. They draw an annual pay of about \$95,000. Nine of these men are full time assigned here by the armed forces.

These men are not proud of our armory like they are of our churches, our new Rockwell plant, our newly paved streets, our new natural gas system, our new shopping center and of the other many fine modern improvements which make Statesboro and Bulloch county such that they are impelled to boast of it.

Until four years ago no armories had been built in Georgia in 25 years. Then one was built in Atlanta. Finally federal legislation was enacted to put up 75 per cent of the cost of such buildings, while the state and local governments put up the remaining 25 per cent.

Since then, through the cooperation of mayors, county commissioners, local citizens groups and members of the General Assembly, 49 National Guard Armories have been erected in the last three or four years. These are the figures revealed by Lt. Governor Ernest Vandiver, speaking at the dedication program of Swainsboro's new armory last

We know that our local governments have been thinking about this-but their thinking has been going on for a long long time, and there's such a thing as time running out.

There can be no disagreement that the proposition is a good one-from all angles.
