Extension Dairyman Frank Fitch says you can tell high quality hay by its green color and a high proportion of leaves and fine stems. Hay cut before bloom or in early bloom tastes better, contains nearly twice as much protein, is about 20 per cent more digestible, and will produce more cans of milk per ton or per acre than late-cut, over-mature hay, he adds.

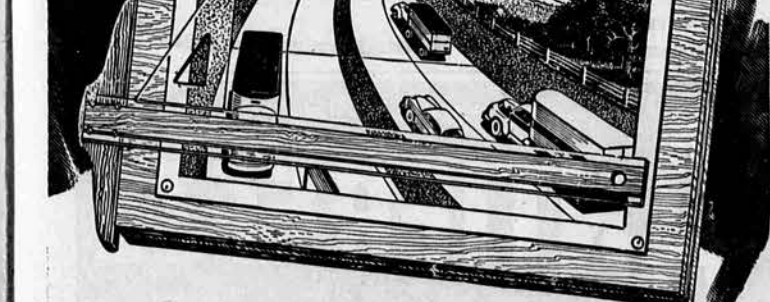
