Farm Briefs

Plans for fighting pecan scab in Bulloch county were made at a committee meeting this week.

Those present first planned to do some top working on the trees and convert many of the now non-producers into profitable varieties.

Experimental results have shown that spraying paper shelled pecans will control scab, but none of the Bulloch county farmers have tried it.

Mr. Bohler stated that following the demonstration, there was no reason why anyone could not cut back their own trees. He agreed to return to these same trees in June for a budding demonstration and felt that anyone desiring to top work their trees could properly carry out the operation.

FARMERS URGED TO APPLY FOR CROP INSURANCE

Farmers in Bulloch county were urged today not to let the time slip up on them in filing applications for cotton crop insurance. The closing date for accepting applications is March 23, or seeding time, whichever is earlier, according to J. A. Banks, chairman of the AAA county committee.

There's a double reason for farmers to get their applications in early," Mr. Banks explained. "One reason is for each farmer individually to have protection against all unavoidable natural hazards, which only Federal crop insurance can give him. Insurance protection starts when the cotton is planted.

The other reason is much that the county has the required number of growers cooperating in the insurance program. Before crop insurance is available in any county, applications must be filed which cover at least 50 farms or one-third of the farms growing insurable crops. Any landlord, owner, tenant, or sharecropper may insure his interest in a crop up to 5 percent of the average yield."

The State Highway Department has just informed us of the re-opening of all Burton's Ferry road contracts from Statesboro to Sylvania, and an early letting of ten miles of paving from the Teachers College to Denmark on State Route 67 to Pembroke. Surveys and plans for post roads in the county are nearing completion and we expect soon to see contracts let for completion of grading and paving of several of these roads.

Since our work has been practically stopped during the war, I will appreciate the opportunity of serving you again for the next two years as chairman of the board of commissioners, and with my past experience, if re-elected I feel I can carry to completion the program set up by your board of commissioners.
