1. Petitioners desire to obtain a charter for a private corporation under the name of "Bulloch Military Association, Inc.," for a period of thirty-five years, with its principal office in Statesboro, Ga.

2. Said corporation is not organized for pecuniary gain or proganized for pecuniary gain or pro-fit, and has no capital stock, its object and design being to provide the facilities for and to aid and promote the functioning of an effective military organization in Bulloch county.

3. It is desired that said co poration be empowered, (a) To succeed to all the rights and powsucceed to all the rights and pow-ers of a previously non-chartered lorganization known as "The Mili-tary Association of Bulloch coun-ty," (b) to receive from said pre-decessor organization all funds and assets its owners or board of control may desire to transfer to control may desire to transfer this corporation, and to receive property, real or personal, th may be made to it, and to hold in trust, all such funds and prop erties, for the purpose of the corporation; (c) To acquire by pur poration; (c) To acquire by pun-chase and hold all such property, real or personal, as its directors may consider necessary in carry-ing out its purposes; and (d) To sell or encumber any of its prop-erties as in the judgment of said directors may best serve the pur-poses of said corporation.

4. The fiscal affairs of said cor poration shall be under the con trol of a board of directors, con sisting of fifteen members, to in clude the chairman of the Board of Commissioners of Roads and Revenues of Bulloch county and the Mayor of the City of States-boro as ex-officio members. The terms of the chairman of said Board and of said mayor shall be co-existent with their tenure of said offices, to be succeeded by their successors in office, and the terms of the other thirteen mem-bers shall continue until termin-


