STATESBORO ARMY AIR FIELD CANTONMENT AREA LOCATED APPROXIMATELY 2.3 MILES NORTH-EAST OF STATESBORO, BULLOCH COUNTY GEORGIA, ON STATE HIGHWAY NO. 73 IN THE 1209th GEORGIA MILITARY DISTRICT OF BULLOCH COUNTY, GEORGIA.

The following buildings, exclusive of personal property are now available for disposal to priority holders under the Surplus Property Act of 1944, as amended, and War Assets Administration Regulation 5, as amended, for removal off-site use only.

### BARRACKS AND SIMILAR BUILDINGS.

These will be available to the following priority holders, in the order listed, for ten (10) days beginning November 14, 1946, and ending November 23, 1946.

- (1) Government Agencies.
- (2) Reconstruction Finance Corporation for resale to small business.
- (3) State and Local Governments.
- (4) Non-profit institutions.

Any buildings not claimed by the above priority holders within the ten (10) day period will be available for sale exclusively to persons certifying that the buildings or resulting materials will be used for the construction under HH ratings of housing accommodations under the Veterans' Emergency Housing Program.

HH ratings are for Veterans housing only and can be obtained by applying to the Federal Housing Administration, 101 Marietta Street Building, Atlanta, Georgia, and conforming with regulations which will be explained at that office.

Disposal of these buildings, individually or in such groups as War Assets Administration may determine, will be to the highest acceptable bidder holding an HH rating, who submit a sealed bid, accompanied by cashier's check, certified check, or United States Post Office Money Order, in an amount representing ten per cent of the total amount of such bid. All bids must be submitted on forms and in accordance with instructions and conditions now available at the War Assets Administration at the address given at the bottom of this advertisement.

Bids will be publicly opened at the address given below on Monday, December 9, 1946, at 2:00 P.M., E. S. T., and no bid received after that time will be considered. War Assets Administration reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

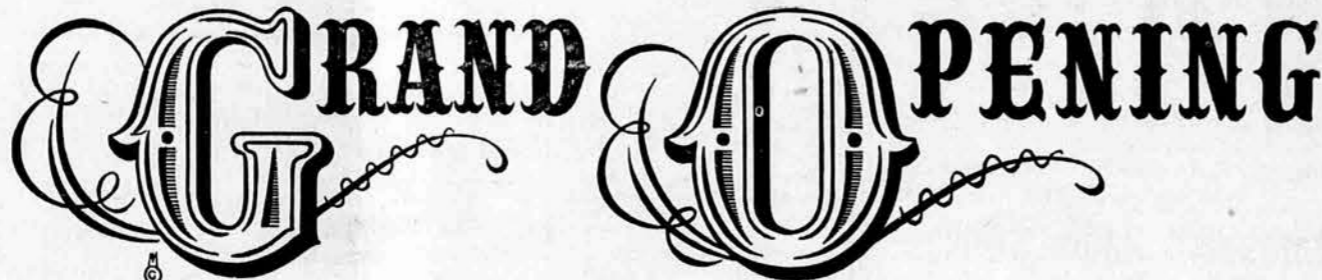

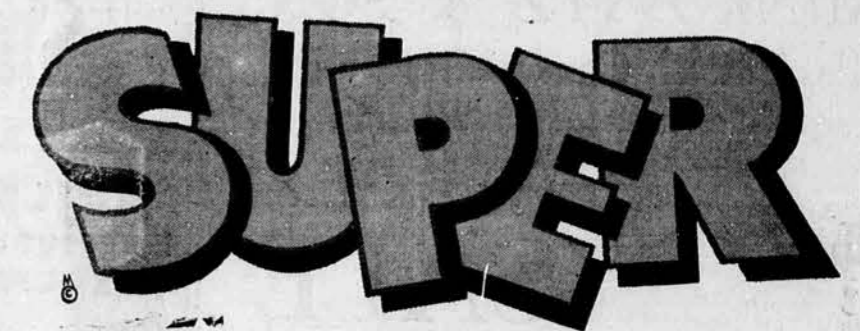
