

The story of the first transportation for school children in Bulloch county is told in this month's Georgia Education Association Journal by W. E. McElven, superintendent of schools in Bulloch county.

He describes how the schools in Bulloch county.

He describes how the school transportation grew from the other team through the horse and buggy stage, the Model Ts, the Mode vidual owned the chassis.
