NEW PACKING PLANT STARTS OPERATIONS AT VIDALIA VIDALIA, Ga., March 6.—One of the most important industrial plants of this section opened at Vidalia this week when the Allen Packing Co. went on a full-time schedule at their newly built and equipped plant in the northeastern part of the city. The business is owned and operated by Herbert F. Allen Jr. L. H. Moss is plant superintendent. Mr. Allen said that he had invested \$75,000 in building and machinery. The plant has 10,000 square feet of concrete floor space in use. The plant will take care of a kill of 500 hogs and 40 cattle per day. The sausage plant can turn out 35,000 to 40,000 pounds of sausage, wieners, bologna and other types of sausage in a 10-hour day. The plant will process hogs for tenderized hams, picnic-type hams, smoked sides and bacon strips. A lard rendering outfit and tankage cooker is installed to recover fats. The tankage cooker will produce as a sideline dried tankage for use as feed. A freezing room is provided for use in processing beef for butchers and silent cutters, mixers, grinders and linker machines are in use. Mr. Moss said that custom butchering would be given attention to.
