

THIS NEWSPAPER has pointed out in the past the dire need for an organized, adequately financed effort to attract new industry to Screven

No better evidence that this need still exists can be found than in a statement made recently by Clark Gaines, secretary of the State Depart ment of Commerce, before the Public Works Committee of the national House of Representatives

His statement included statistics on the new industries which have been established in counties on the Georgia side of the Savannah River area during the past nine years.

The table shows Screven county had 19 industries in 1940 and in the period from 1940 to 1949 added only two new industries.

and in the nine years since then have added 16 -Abraham Lincoln. new industries. Another county comparable in size to Screven is Washington. In 1940 that county had 34 industries and up to 1949 had added 18 new in-

Why has Screven county been so neglected in the location of new industries? Mainly because Screven county has not been out fighting to get industry to locate here.

It is true that some work has been done and is being done to attract industry here, but we just naven't put our whole heart into it so far.

Lacking a Chamber of Commerce with a fulltime paid secretary who could devote all his time to such matters, our next best bet is an industria development corporation. This can be done only if the people of the county, who will stand to benefit from new industry, are willing to invest a little capital in it.


