War On Bugs In Bulloch Bigger The war on bugs in Bulloch county seems to be bigger than ever this year, with many new insects showing up. Thrips has shown up on peanuts again this year, causing the bud and tender leaves to look weather-beaten and the peanuts stop growing. Tospoxene is recommended by the experiment stations as the best control known for them. Some are using five per cent DDT and sulphur effectively. Corn-eat worms are worse than normal on mutton corn. The five per cent DDT and talc mixture is giving good control of this pest. Boll weevils are extremely active already. The 3-5-40 BHC and Tospoxene, 2-4-20, are recommended. All adults who are recommended for controlling them. The BHC is perhaps giving the best control on cotton lice.
