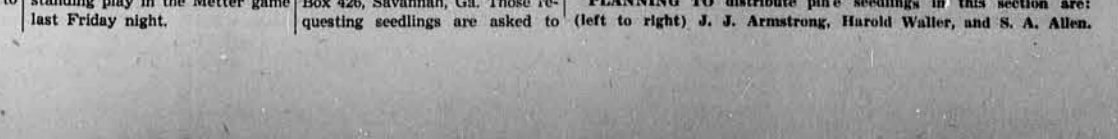
## Farmers to Be Given Slash Pine Seedlings

Thousands of additional slash pine seedlings are expected to be planted in Bulloch county within the next three months as the result of a forest conservation program sponsored jointly by Union Bag & Paper Corporation and S. A. Allen, Inc., pulpwood shippers.

The distribution of the seedlings and instructions in correct planting techniques will be in charge of Ralph D. Helmken, conservation forester for Union Bag & Paper, who cooperates with the Allen organization in promoting forest conservation activities, will render every assistance possible to landowners who have reforestation problems, it is stated.

Mr. Armstrong stated that the cooperative tree-planting program, which provides seedlings, tree-planting machines and proper supervision at no cost to the landowners, is one of the first of its kind announced for this section of Georgia.

It is now too late to be assured that your order of seedlings will be completely filled. However, many are still wishing to receive an order can get the blanks from County Ranger J. W. Roberts or by writing to the Georgia Forestry Commission, 435 State Capitol, Atlanta, Ga. The price of most species is \$2.50 per thousand and an additional 25 cents is assessed for delivery by state truck.

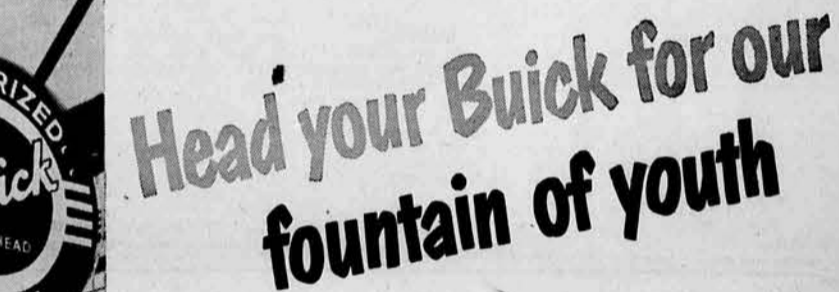
