## -Peanut Farmers-

Congress has passed and the President has signed H.J. Res. 398, the "Cotton and Peanut" bill, amending the Agricultural Adjustment Act and containing, among other things, changes in the marketing quota provisions for cotton and peanuts.

In order to qualify as a Cooperator, the excess production of peanuts permitted under this new law must be delivered to an agency designated by the Secretary of Agriculture at the market value of the peanuts for oil and meal less the costs of handling.

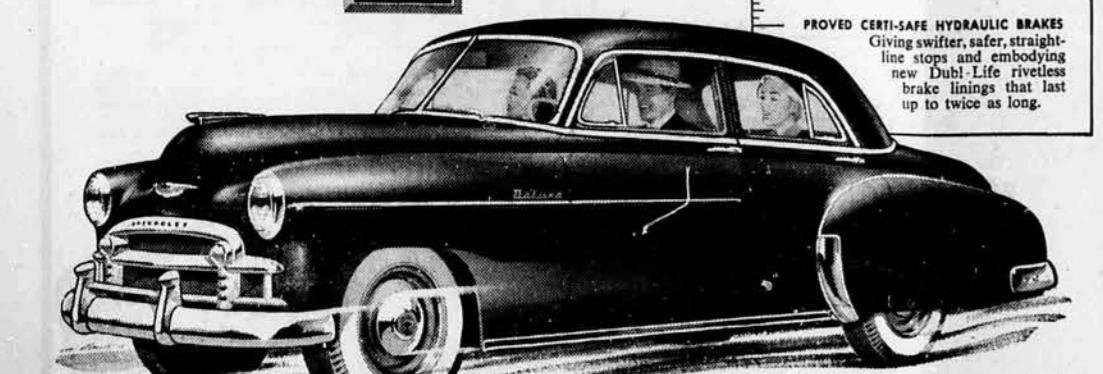
Many growers, because of extremely heavy cuts in their acreage by reduced allotments and having a surplus of labor, land and machinery, will be interested in growing some excess peanuts at the oil price.

The new law provides that the Secretary of Agriculture may also, under certain conditions, sell excess peanuts for edible uses, if they are needed, at not less than the price at which quota peanuts may be sold, which would be 105% of the support price.

### Barn Spraying Begins On May 1

The barn spraying program will begin in Bulloch county on May 1. The program is sponsored by the county principally as a fly control program. Chloroform will be used for spraying barns and other out-buildings where the owners or tenants request such spraying.

The individual's portion of the cost of the program will amount to 10 cents for each pound (approximately 85 cents gallon) of emulsion applied at his place, with a minimum charge of \$1.75, to be paid at the time of the spraying.
