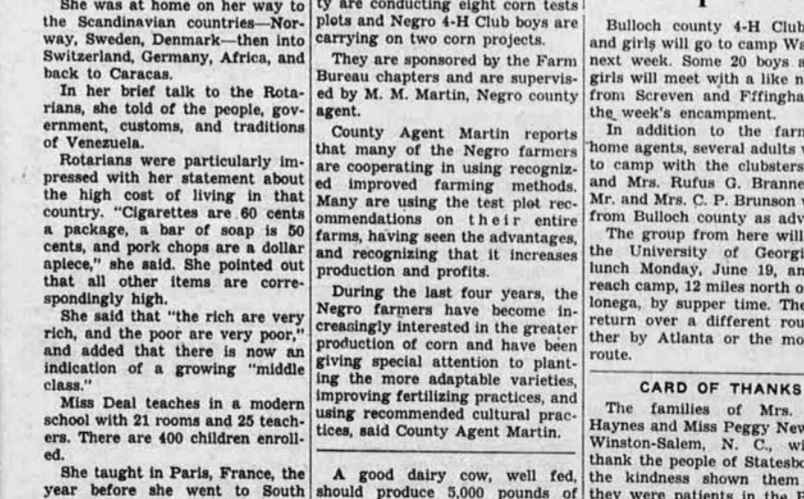

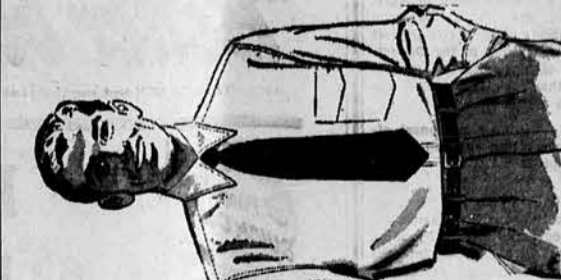

Those present expressed belief that if everyone in the community waged an effective campaign against weevils it would do more good than if a few in the community poisoned for them. As a result, all planned to start their control program and continue through the season.

The Associated Women have renovated three classrooms in the school building for the children, the juniors and young people. The ladies already had a room for their meetings. The men meet in the auditorium. The entire group, now around 800, sat together, divide to discuss their business, and then combine in the auditorium for a part of their program.
