We don't mean just the crippling effects to the human body. In addition to that there is the tremendous financial burden that the disease brings with it. Recent tests conducted in Maryland under the auspices of the Federal Bureau of Public Roads, demonstrates that heavily loaded trucks ruin pavements. The tests have been conducted for six months over pavements closed to other traffic. In three months the 18,000 pound axle loaded truck caused 82 feet of new cracks in the half-mile concrete test lane. Heavier trucks cause up to 2,968 feet of cracks. The damage from the most heavily loaded trucks was so great that the tests had to be suspended.
