63 Percent Make 70 on Selective Service Tests

Sixty-three percent of the 339,000 students who took the Selective Service College Qualification Tests last spring and summer made a score of 70 or better, Major General Lewis B. Hershey, Director of Selective Service, reported today, and he also reminded college students that the deadline for submitting applications for the December 13, 1951 test is approaching. He said a further breakdown of the results of the former tests would be available within a short time.

The new series of tests will be given Thursday, December 13, 1951, and Thursday, April 24, 1952, by the Educational Testing Service of Princeton, N. J., at more than 1,000 different centers throughout the United States and its territories. The blanks may be obtained by the registrant at any local board office.

General Hershey stressed the importance of all eligible students taking the test, and indicated that those who do not have test score results in their cover sheets may have a "very difficult time indeed" in convincing their local boards that they should be deferred as students.
