All Contracts On New Hospital Near Completion Now

FIVE CONTRACTS OF THE FINAL NINE HAVE BEEN COMPLETED WITH OTHERS TO BE COMPLETED IN FEW DAYS.

With Wednesday the last day for the completion of the nine contracts for equipment for the Bulloch County Hospital, five contracts have been completed and the equipment for the other four is either on the ground or en route.

Following the completion of the hospital several months ago by the Artley Company of Savannah, the equipment from the old hospital was moved into the new building temporarily.

The projects announced completed today and the successful bidders are: office equipment, Banner States Printing Company; stoves, E. A. Smith Grain Co.; private room equipment, Hillrom Company; kitchen equipment, Wright Company; X-Ray equipment, S. & H. X-Ray Company; The ward equipment to be furnished by the Wachtel Supply Company of Savannah has not been ordered.

The construction work being done by Averitt Bros. and Sargent is 90 percent complete and with a few finishing touches on the basement floor will be ready for use.

To those who have not seen the hospital equipment there is a pleasant surprise in store.
