Tuesday at the Bulloch Stock Yard 710 hogs and 225 head of cattle were auctioned. Tops brought from \$7.25 to \$7.50 according to quality.

Wednesday, the Statesboro Livestock Commission Company sold 1669 hogs and 879 cattle. Several lots of corn fed top hogs brought \$7.50 a hundred.
