County School Superintendent Makes 1937 County School Report
According to the report of the County School Superintendent for 1937 the fourteen county schools (does not include the Statesboro schools) had an average enrollment of 4,040 pupils with 2,033 girls and 2,007 boys. The 36 colored schools had a total enrollment of 2,282.

1,829 FARMERS RECEIVING SOIL CHECKS
Soil conservation checks totaling about \$93,000 were distributed by the county agent to 1,827 Bulloch county farmers. This represents 1041 work sheets for 1937 out of the total of 1697 signed. However, there are several of the total that will not get any payment due to the cotton and tobacco or one of the other crops being the base for the farm covered.
