The first after the war was a little old log jatl which afterwards was used as a barn. The next was a plank jail, built up on North Main street, by Wm. H. DeLoach, Sr., and later was moved to the court house square.

cently torn down, and in its place a modern, handsome structure has been built which will be sufficient for the needs of the county for many years to come. It has been recently completed at a total cost of \$7,750 for the house and cells, The building cost \$2,500 and the cells \$5,250. It is a roomy building and arranged with water works and a system of sewerage. The front is used by the jailer as a residence, with three rooms down, and two upstairs. The cells for prisoners are in the rear of the building, with cells downstairs for women and boys, and upstairs for the male prisoners and separate cells for white and black.

SOME JAIL HISTORY: The several jails which the county has had in the past have held criminals charged with all sorts of crimes, and many have escaped from every jail that we have had.

Only three persons have ever been brought to the gallows in Bulloch county, while no doubt, some of the uinetynine guilty ones have escaped, that ought to have been hung. The first legal execution in the county took place on December 17th, 1879, when Drew Holloway, a negro, was bung for the murder of Brinson Brown, also colored. Hangings were something new in this section and a crowd, estimated were something new in this section and a crowd, estimated at 5,000 were present on that day. Some had imbibed freely, and some of the Cobbtown,boys assured Drew that he was on the way to hell. E. M. McElveen was sheriff. The was on the way to hell. P. M. McElveen was sherlif. 






On Sunday, September 2rd, 1882 the following named persons were duly constituted into a Baptist church, viz: Edmond Kennedy and his wife, Elizabeth; A. B. Miller and his wife Moselle; Joseph Tillman and his wife, Mary; W. B. Corey, Jas. Price, W. J. M. Griner and Miss Mary J. Proctor, forming the first church organized in Statesboro. Rev. W. M. Cowart was the first pastor and filled the place acceptably for several years.

In the spring of 1884 the church, though few in number, rected a house of worship and not long thereafter the building was blown down. Building the house cost the membership sacrifices, and to have it destroyed seemen, to the small number, hard to overcome; and so it was some time before the struggling band could get in shape to rebuild. But with heroic faith they undertook to have a meeting house again and the old saw: "Where there's a will there's a way," was verified. But it seems that their joy in having a place in which to meet and worship God was of short duration, for, as they were finishing the house and had started the painting they were plunged into grief again-their church house was destroyed by fire ed into grief again—their church house was destroyed by fire. In the mean time they had increased in numbers and although not strong, with a sublime faith, they heroically went to work and in the year 1887, or five years after they were organized, they had built their third church building, which house, with additions from time to time, did service until tora down to make room for the handsome edifice which now adorns the old

During the year 1900 Rev. J. F. McMillan, who was then paster, determined, in his earnest desire to see his people have a honse in keeping with their numerical strength (about 170 members), with their financial ability and with the growth and substantial development of Statesboro, was successful in inspiring the membership to build such a house. Messrs. W. C. Parker, W. M. Foy, H. S. Blitch, J. B. Cone, M. E. Grimes and C. A. Lauier were appointed a building committee and how well they performed their arduous duties the building speaks for it-

The Baptists wisely decided not to undertake more than they could manage and so the Sunday School room, which will be at the rear of the church, was left off the plans and only the main building was erected. They hope in a year or two to be able to make the additions which will complete the plans and give them a house which will seat about 600 people. The house was built at a cost of \$5,800 and was turned ov-er to the church for use on the second Sunday in February, 1902.
